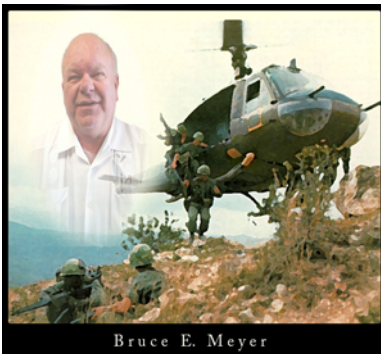

Update on the \$25,000 Donor Challenge From Vietnam Vet - Bruce E. Meyer & Extension of Challenge to December 31, 2007

As of October 23, 2007, the Challenge has raised **\$14,975** towards the \$25,000 from Bruce E. Meyer. As you may recall, Bruce, a former pilot with the 176th Assault Helicopter Company in Vietnam, was motivated to help the children after learning about the efforts of VSO. **This challenge is being held in conjunction with our Annual Fund Drive which will be used to fund our 2008 Program.**

By now, we hope you have had the chance to read the David M. Berdy M.D. health report and our recommendations to make those a reality. Many of these recommendations will become projects in 2008.

If you have not had an opportunity to make a contribution yet, we hope you will consider VSO and what we hope to accomplish in 2008. With Bruce's approval, the Challenge has been extended until December 31, 2007.
