Originally founded in 1975 by Sisters of the Miraculous Medal, the Dak Rowa community really began receiving children in 1994. Since then, Sister Y Truk has been the guiding force, working tirelessly to make sure that the 32 children under her care are provided for physically, educationally and spiritually. Located in a rural area outside of Kontum, Dak Rowa has not benefited from tourist visits, and must rely completely upon themselves (13 boys & 19 girls, ages 7 to late teens) for basic survival.

Not long ago, Friends of the Central Highlands (FOCH) "discovered" Dak Rowa and immediately allocated funds to improve life there. They call it the "Jackfruit" orphanage since a number of jackfruit trees grow nearby. During our February visit to Vinh Son, FVSO also identified the dire situation at Dak Rowa and made plans to "adopt" what we now refer to as Vinh Son 5. Our Board has voted in agreement and help is already on the way.

- Population – more than 500 Montagnard children in five facilities
- Administered by the Sisters of the Miraculous Medal
- Location - Kontum, Vietnam
- About \$12 feeds, shelters, and educates one child for one month

Vinh Son 5, aka Jackfruit



FOCH has been very active in helping "Jackfruit" with basic needs, a new kitchen roof, beds, bath house and showers. Along with new clothes, dental visits have also been scheduled. For its part, FVSO has recently sent funds for: 1) school fees for the 2009-2010 school year, 2) rice, breakfast noodles and protein supplement, and 3) parasite medication.

The 32 children, 2 Sisters and 5 caregivers are counting on us. We won't let them down.

Semi-Annual Board Meeting (June 10, 2009)

With 11 of the 13 Board members present, either in person or on the speaker phone, the meeting lasted for about two and a half hours and covered a wide range of topics. After a brief, but thorough, summary of conditions at each of the Vinh Son locations, a project status report and discussion followed (refer to the chart below). Of particular interest, the topic of Education was an area where we spent considerable time. Before FVSO can provide tutors for the children, we must first develop methods for tracking achievement and progress. We also need a better understanding of how language skills are taught (both speaking and writing). Lastly, we raised the possibility of creating a scholarship program for students who have the talent to further their education. More to come on this. Other topics included finance, the web site, fundraising, succession planning, maintenance programs, and Dak Rowa (now referred to as Vinh Son 5).

Your Donations At Work

At left is a summary of the 2009 year-to-date disbursements, a total of \$45,459. While nearly 77% of the funds address ongoing basic needs, special projects account for \$10,587. As you can see, FVSO solves for a very wide variety of specific needs...from mosquito nets to school room doors to chickens. Each one of these projects requires approval from our Board. We also receive photographs and receipts from Vinh Son upon completion of the project.

The Q-3 expenditure for education covers the 2009-2010 school year for VS2-3-4-5 (FOCH provides for VS1).

Total donations during the period amount to \$31,810. With the annual fundraiser coming in September, all of us at FVSO are greatly appreciative of the support you give the children day-in and day-out.
