Dave Chaix's 2017 Trip Report

On the evening of January 8th, we left Auburn, CA by bus with 17 travelers from the Auburn, Sacramento and El Dorado County areas. We had an early morning flight to catch from San Francisco to Bangkok via Taipei. There, after meeting our wonderful guide Tano, we changed planes for Chiang Rai and the northern most tip of Thailand, the "Golden Triangle". From there, to Chiang Mai, then Kachumburi (bridge over the River Kwai) and back to Bangkok for a couple days of touring.

We left Thailand for Saigon on January 19th with an overnight, then a flight to Pleiku and a bus ride to Kontum. Thus began the real purpose of the trip, to visit all 7 orphanages at Vinh Son and Sao Mai.

That evening, we re-grouped at the old Wooden Church in front of VS 1, then entered the orphanage to find a pre-Tet celebration in full swing. All the Sisters of the orphanages were present, along with the new Mother Superior, Sister Imelda. Much entertainment by the children and a good time was had by all.

Over the next 4 days, we visited all the orphanages, played with the children and spent quality time with the Sisters. Mainly, we wanted to observe how the orphanages were doing and review immediate needs.

Four projects were funded onsite:

- VS 6 – Ten bicycles for the High School children \$1,000 USD. These bicycles were needed because VS 6 is the most remote facility and the children are a long way from the school.
- VS 1 – Replace the rice cooker \$360 USD
- VS 1 – Replace the Bread Bakery \$800 USD
- VS 1 – Repair the septic system at the Boy's washroom \$500 USD


Two projects could not immediately be funded:

- VS 4 – Needs a new tractor \$9,000 USD – current tractor was purchased in 2008 by FVSO and desperately needs replacing.
- VS 6 – Needs the washroom rebuilt \$4,500 – almost not functional and becoming a health hazard.

Finally, we traveled back to Pleiku for our visit at the Sao Mai orphanage. For the first time, we also visited the disabled children who live at a different facility. It's great to see Sister Kiet...she always makes our visits very memorable.

Bottom line...we found the orphanages continuing to improve, taking on more of their own support, via farming (coffee, rubber, manioc, etc. to sell), gardens, pigs, chickens and fish ponds to help feed the children.

The Sisters and children work so hard, but still need our help.

Higher Education Scholarship Update

Our plan has been to provide scholarships of \$75 per month for students who do not have a specific sponsor. According to Y Rim and Y Rin this is an adequate amount so long as the student lives at the orphanage and works part time there in exchange for room and board.

Students who go to school outside of Kontum and are required to pay their own room and board need more to get by. Some are able to find part time work and others may receive scholarships from individuals of up to \$150 per month plus tuition.

10 students are receiving scholarships today

Y Lyly – Will complete her nursing degree at Duc Tri College in Da Nang in May 2017. Receives \$150/month plus tuition VS-2

Y Hoi - Graduated with a nursing degree from Duc Tri College in May 2016. Now is studying to be a Y Si at Medical College of Kontum. When this 2 year program is complete she will operate clinics at 6 remote villages working for the priest. Receives \$75/month VS-2

Y Rim – Studying nursing at Medical School of Kontum with plans to graduate in May 2018. Receives \$75 per month VS-2

Y Rin – Working on pharmacy degree at Medical School of Kontum with plans to graduate in May 2018. Receives \$75/month VS-6

A Xok – Studying Computer Tech at College of Technology & Information at Hue with plans to graduate in May 2018. Receives \$75/month VS-1

A Thuy – Studying Computer Information Technology at HCMC University of Technology with plans to graduate in May 2019. Receives \$75/month VS-1

A Thang – Studying auto mechanics at Phuoc Loc Vocational Center in Vung Tau with plans to graduate in May 2018. He is a high school student and stays at a parish center. Receives \$75/month VS-1

A Toan – Studying auto mechanics at Phuoc Loc Vocational Center in Vung Tau with plans to graduate in May 2018. He is a high school student and stays at a parish center. Receives \$75/month VS-1

Y Thoai – Studying Nursing at Medical School of Kontum with plans to graduate in May 2018. Receives \$75 per month VS-2

Y Lit – Just completing a degree to teach at a nursery school at Saigon School of Technology. She has a job teaching and her scholarship will end in one month. Receives \$75/month VS-3

How are you doing? I am fine. Dear Dad, during the internship at the district health care center Dak To, I see the hospital is very clean, spacious and airy. There are some departments namely:

- Internal Medicine
- Pediatrics

Each department is located far away from each other. There are many patients coming to the hospital, so I could have chances to improve my medical skills as well.

All doctors and assistants at the hospital welcomed me with open arms. I feel very happy when people give specific instructions for me if I don't know with their enthusiasm. The Lunar New Year is coming in two weeks, and I am going to spend my holiday time and put all efforts to complete my graduation report. However, I only have one week to stay home for the New Year because I have to go to Da Nang City to do the exam.

At home, I have less time to finish my job since I need to take care of my brother's children and do housework. Thus, I could not make a chance to visit kids in the orphanage. I already told with people working in the orphanage that I was busy due to the internship this month.

My brother, sister in law, younger sister and I are living together, but my mom does not stay with us because she has to work in order to keep a family. She can come back home in the morning only. Now, at that house, we are living up to 7 people since my old house still has not been fixed yet... I am okay as I can visit to the orphanage and my brother's house to have fun. Sometimes, I feel sad, but I think I should not have that feeling.

I think I feel unhappy because between the world of social networks and the real life, I always live under illusion whenever I have happiness or sadness. Consequently, some of my friends would say I was a crazy and weird person like kids. Others did not understand about personality, so they just put a slur upon me. But, I ignored their comments, and laughed.

I was very lucky when I have a new father like you after my biological father passed away. Sometimes, I really want to talk and share my stories with you, but my foreign language is very poor; thus, I could not take the opportunity to have conversations with you. I am so sorry about that. I also thank God for protecting me. Thanks Daddy for helping me with my tuition fees and keeping my spirits up. During Christmas, I have not been written a letter in order to send to you and other benefactors for assisting kids in receiving education. Please send my sincere thanks to your friends for helping kids, also.
