- Population – about 600 Montagnard children in six facilities
- Administered by the Sisters of the Miraculous Medal
- Location - Kontum, Vietnam
- \$15 feeds, shelters, and educates one child for one month

A message from Dave Chaix, FVSO President

For the most part, 2009 was a very good year for the 550 children and their caregivers at the 6 Vinh Son Montagnard orphanages. That's right, there are now 6 orphanages supported by FVSO. As the Sisters identify more children at risk, communities are established to serve them. After much discussion by Board Members, we decided to add 2 small, very poor orphanages that will fall under the Vinh Son umbrella. We began supporting them at the end of 2009 and will continue during 2010. Expanding our reach is only made possible because of the generous support from you - our wonderful donors – **Thank You!**

In terms of accomplishments, 2009 was again truly outstanding. Early in the year, a group of supporters led by some of our Board Members visited the Orphanages and came away with a good understanding of how the funds are being spent and the progress being made. While there, we distributed funding for a number of projects, as well as making an assessment for 2009. As is our custom on these visits, we developed both short and long term goals through our open dialogue with the caregivers at each orphanage site. The result is a roadmap, most of which we can use year-on-year:

Immediate

- Daily food (rice, bread flour, powdered milk) – always **PRIORITY #1**
- Diet supplements (fish, meat and vegetables)
- Building repairs and improvements
- Medicine and dental care
- Water Filtration System

Long Term

- Education (school fees, desks, uniforms, computers)
- Bedroom supplies, kitchen supplies
- Training (sewing machines, tractor operation)
- Machinery (new tractor, plow, trailer, diesel fuel)
- Physical plant (Boy's dormitories, Living Room, Dining Rooms)
- Capital projects (pig farm and barn, feed)

Typhoon Ketsana hit the Central Highlands in late September and did considerable damage at the Orphanages. Again, we asked for your help, and you responded. The results speak for themselves:

Typhoon Ketsana – Actions Taken

- Rebuilt walls and buildings
- Replaced crops and vegetable gardens
- Rebuilt a field hut
- Provided emergency funds for food and medicine
- Repaired a piggery and replaced the pigs
- Replaced lost food stores

Many projects were done in partnership with our old friends: Friends of the Central Highlands, East Meets West and Colour for Kids of the Netherlands. We also welcomed new partners: 1) Stichting of the Netherlands, 2) VN-SHEP (Vietnam Social Health Education Projects) Linden, New Jersey, 3) Auburn Rotary Club, Auburn, CA, and 4) Terres des Hommes, Canada. Working together, resources were targeted, timely, and sufficient to get the job done. It's been a real pleasure working with these groups and individuals from around the world.

This year we anchored our Annual Fund Drive with 4 Challenges, and again these Challenges provided a great incentive for our donors, who reacted with enthusiasm and generosity. Each Challenge was maxed out, resulting in a total of \$42,200 in donations. WOW! What a great way to end the year; it could not have come at a better time with needs so great. FVSO reached its 2009 financial target, and was able to fulfill every commitment made to the children of Vinh Son...once again!!!

The new year of 2010 is upon us. We'll continue to be very vigilant in our efforts to combat the lingering effects of Ketsana. The needs will only grow as we add other Vinh Son orphanages in the Kontum area. Project Manager, Bart Ruud, and I will travel to Kontum in February to assess 2010 needs and close the books on a very successful 2009. **These trips, as with all FVSO expenses,** are paid by the travelers themselves. Our commitment remains...100% of your donations go directly to support the children and caregivers. Look for our trip summary upon our return.

Again, we are so very grateful for your support of these wonderful children, and hope that you continue to help them in 2010. Our donation target this year is \$75,000, which is about what was spent in 2009.
