

### Coronavirus – Special Projects – Student Profile

#### **Coronavirus in Vietnam**

#### UPDATED: March 3rd, 2020

Since the start of the coronavirus (COVID-19) outbreak, Vietnam has closely monitored the situation and installed a series of proactive, comprehensive measures to combat the spread of the virus within the country and prepare its public health services. Past experience with other epidemics places Vietnam in a strong position to protect its population as well as visitors passing through.

**Vietnam is sharply divided** on how long to close schools because of the coronavirus, which has prevented parents from going to work and threatens further economic damage. Supporters want to keep students at home until April, while opponents say the panic is overblown.



At Vinh Son, the children find ways to stay busy and keep up with their education. However, school classes remain cancelled. Foreign visitors are not allowed entry into the orphanages.

#### Projects planned after the 2020 on-site review: \$78,875 expected cost

- VS-1: Bedrooms, classrooms, stilt house replacement (\$13,700)
- VS-2: Diapers, repair and upgrade of the boy's dorm (\$17,475)
- VS-4: Well drilling (\$4,700) and fertilizer for farming (\$2,200)
- VS-6: Girl's bathroom (\$5,300)
- VS-5: Chicken Farm, new hall (\$35,500)
- VS-3: Funds already delivered for new bedrooms and toilets

#### **Ro Cham Profile**

We first learned of Ro Cham (above) in the FVSO Nov 2017 Newsletter. Since then, he has been attending school and adapting very well. We will continue to follow scholarship students, collecting profiles when possible, and will share them.

#### **Student Profile**

Ro Cham was born in a small Jarai village and has 4 brothers. They were very poor and many times, when there was no rice to eat, his mother had to beg for food for the children. At some point, Sister Khiet welcomed him into the Sao Mai orphanage. Ro Cham's dream was always to go to school, and because he never gave up on that dream, he was able to complete high school in 2017. Sister Khiet recommended him for a scholarship and upon our approval, many wonderful contributors assured that he was able to attend the Community Service program at Gai Lai (Pleiku) Vocational College.

The first day he entered the Gia Lai College, he was very shy and did not dare to talk to anyone. But after awhile, he became accustomed to the new environment and made friends, realizing that all these new people were gifts as well. Because of them, he learned many things and became much more confident.

Ro Cham really found happiness when he began participating in the required field trips to visit and interact with people in the villages. Although the people did not know who this group of students were, they were welcomed enthusiastically, which made the students very happy. On many field trips, teachers led them to small villages to visit the poor, and they had especially great times with the children. The boys and girls in the villages had slightly darker skin with thin bodies and appeared to be very poor. The images of these children caused Ro Cham to think about the gifts he has received in his life.

The FVSO Board recently announced that they have increased the quarterly contributions to the 6 Vinh Son orphanages by 15%. The new rate goes into effect for the 2<sup>nd</sup> quarter, and represents an annual increase of \$11,620 which will be spent on Basic Needs. News of this increase was sent to Sr Myriam, asking that she confirm her understanding of this change.

Once again thank you all. Wish you have good health, peace and happiness. May God bless you.


